## 2020: Our year in review





# Supporting families online

The pandemic changed the way we work, but what we do hasn't changed: delivering the best outcomes for children and families.

In 2019–2020 our staff and the families we work with learned to do things differently through videoconferencing for services, support and inspiration.

#### **Connecting to the NDIS**

The NDIS is a new start in disability support and has completely rolled out across Australia. Plumtree's NDIS workshops educated parents on getting prepared and joining the scheme. Topics included using an e-book developed in-house to gather information for the first planning meeting. Activating a plan, choosing service providers and strategies to get a great plan were explored. Making a child's funds go further via self-management, and discovering what's possible with the different management types were also covered.

"The facilitator was great at explaining things and sharing her experiences, which was very helpful."

#### Learning and playing

Plumtree's free workshops included coaching for parents, toilet training, transition to school and empowering talks for parents of children with disability. Workshops were also held in other languages to inform and connect families.

Our Music Together
Online Playgroup launched successfully during the pandemic. Run by early childhood music specialist Dr Amanda Niland, the free sessions gave children opportunities to communicate, get creative and explore musical instruments, dance and song.

More free online playgroups for babies to preschool-aged children are being planned for 2020–2021.

#### A practical start

Every family begins at a different place, but they need a vision for the future. When families start at Plumtree. a welcome visit connected them with a peer worker with lived experience. Together, they used <u>Pictability</u>, a fun visioning tool developed in-house, to immediately create goals for the entire family and plan practical steps to achieve them.

"When we were first asked to think of a vision for our child, we didn't know what it meant or where to start. Pictability was ingenious and helped us with visioning and setting goals in a very natural way."


#### Planning plays a part

# Now & Next: growth and impact

Our services are just the start. Plumtree's innovative program is transforming the lives of children with disability and their families in Australia and overseas.



A first of its kind in
Australia and evidencebased, Now & Next helps
parents achieve positive
outcomes for the whole
family. It won the 2017
ECIA NSW/ACT Excellence
Award and was a finalist
in the NSW Disability
Innovation Awards.

Run by parents with training and lived experience in disability, Now & Next shows that peer networks and peer workers are a new resource for the future.

Our program is thriving.
Starting with three groups in 2016 at Plumtree's Sydney centre, a total of 50 group programs have been hosted in Australia, New Zealand, Canada and Finland for 493 participants. Nine online groups held from late 2018 were completed by 46 families.

#### **Positive outcomes**

Participants learned to develop a vision for their family using Pictability—a completely different experience to the NDIS planning process. Short and long-term goals were created in three categories: for the child, the family, and themselves.

The results are encouraging. Questionnaire responses and an external evaluation showed an increased sense of empowerment, knowledge, agency and hope at the program's end; increasing satisfaction across the eight sessions; and a better sense of wellbeing among participants. Over 90% of their goals were achieved across the three categories in the face-to-face sessions and over 85% in the online sessions.

# Sharing expertise with communities

Plumtree is collaborating with professionals to deliver better services and outcomes.



#### **Transforming learning**

A Student Voice Project developed by Plumtree launched at three Sydney schools, enabling students with disabilities to shape their educational experience.

Plumtree peer workers facilitated ten programs on identifying student strengths and well-being indicators for meaningful learning outcomes. Pictability was used for developing learning and support plans.

The pilot project used a Child Voice Model developed by Plumtree CEO Sylvana Mahmic and Learning Research Director Dr Annick Janson, a world first in charting a pathway for amplifying children with disabilities' opinions to become independent young adults.

#### **Promoting library inclusion**

Communities are vital for learning and development. Funded by the National Disability Insurance Agency, Plumtree is collaborating with libraries to enhance the visitor experience for children with disability and their families. Library workers are being mentored by our peer workers and professional staff to promote meaningful library access, engagement, and community education on disability.

Resources will be co-designed with families of children with disabilities for national distribution. They include the principles of meaningful inclusion, librarian support, and successful strategies from libraries involved in the two-year pilot project.

#### International collaboration

Our innovations are attracting interest from universities and organisations.

Australian and international academics, researchers, parents of children with a disability, and professionals attended a Melbourne symposium to foster collaboration. La Trobe University and the University of Melbourne are examining Now & Next's processes to inform the program's future development.

Our impact is becoming globally acknowledged. Plumtree was invited to present a webinar Building Capacity Using Family-Centred Approaches for NCAPPS. The US-based organisation provides support and resources that empower people with disability to pursue their vision of a good life.

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

## In 2019–20 our income was a total of \$4,682,333 comprising:

- NDIS income 66%
- Community services 5%
- DEC ECEC preschool 9%
- Other grants & revenue 7%
- JobKeeper & cash flow boost payments 13%

Plumtree is a nongovernment, registered charity. This was our second full year of operation under the NDIS.

#### In 2019–20 our expenditure was \$4,054,441 comprising:

- Employee costs 80%
- Service delivery costs 8%
- Admin costs 8%
- Project expenses 3%
