5. Program and Resource Development

Now & Next program is an 8-week peer-led capacity-building program for parents that was codesigned with parents of young children with disability or developmental delay. The program supports goal setting, family leadership, and parent-peer support. Since its inception in 2015, Now & Next has reached over 2,000 families and is being delivered in Australia and seven countries internationally. It has been featured in policy and practitioner forums as a novel innovation in early childhood intervention.

PictabilityTM is a planning and visioning tool developed to support families in identifying priorities and setting meaningful goals. Grounded in the research on family-centred practice, positive psychology, and gamification, the tool can be used independently by families or facilitated by parent-peer workers or professionals.

Plan & Do is a 28-page paper-based toolkit to assist professionals and parents to work collaboratively on planning and goal setting, particularly within the individual funding context.

9. Research Impact and Legacy: Founding New Peer-Led Organisations

I auspiced two new peer-led organisations: Reframing Autism and Belongside (formerly *Kindred*). Both were established to extend the peer work and family leadership principles to promote stronger peer connection, capability-building, and systems advocacy by and for families of children with disability. I successfully secured funding to establish these organisations and auspiced them through Plumtree Children's Services during their start-up phase which provided the necessary infrastructure while they built their governance, programs, and networks.
